



## Santa's Coat Wall Hanging

**Finished Quilt = 25 x 30 inches**



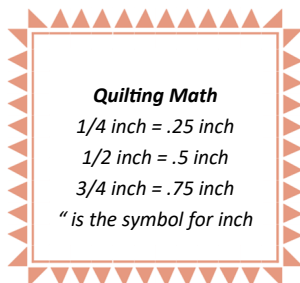
*Intermediate skill level*

### Materials

- 1.5 yards Red Buffalo Plaid Fabric
- 1/4 yard Kona solid Black
- 1.5 yards 4" wide fur trim
- Santa Tea Towel (suggest Mary Lake-Thompson art)
- 1 fat quarter metallic gold fabric
- 1 yard backing fabric
- 1 10" x 10" batting square
- 36" x 36" batting
- 3 black buttons (1.5 inches in diameter)

### General Notes and Instructions

- All seam allowances = 1/4 inch
- All fabrics are sewn with right sides together
- Press all seams open
- Assume width of fabric = 42"



**Quilting Math**

1/4 inch = .25 inch

1/2 inch = .5 inch

3/4 inch = .75 inch

" is the symbol for inch

### Cutting Instructions

#### From Buffalo Plaid

- Cut one (1) 25 x 7.75 inch rectangle
- Cut one (1) 25 x 6.75 inch rectangle
- Cut 4 WOF 2.5" strips for binding.

#### From solid black fabric

- Cut one (1) 25"x 6.75" rectangle

#### From gold metallic

- Cut two (2) 1.5" x 8" strips
- Cut two (2) 1.5" x 10" strips

#### From gold scrap fabric AND the batting

- Cut one (1) EACH 10" square

#### From the green scrap

- Cut two (2) 1.5" x 7" strips
- Cut two (2) 1.5 x 8" strips

#### From the tea towel

- Cut out Santa's Face 7" square

#### From the fur trim

- Cut one 4" x 25" strip
- Cut one 3.25" x 5" strip
- Cut one 3.25 x 17" strip



# Santa's Coat Wall Hanging

## Sewing Instructions

**Step 1:** Cut out three rectangles for the base of the coat (Diagram 1, coat pieces)

**Step 2:** Then sew the rectangles together (Diagram 2, completed coat)

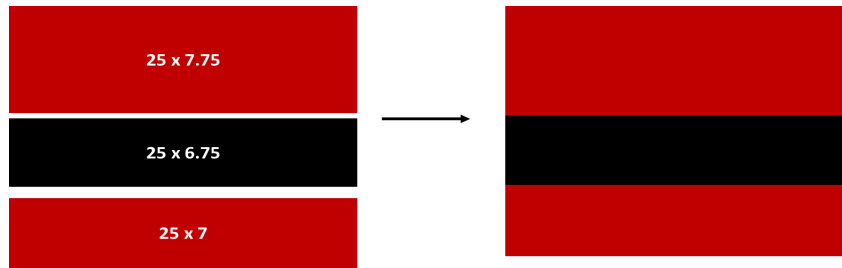


Diagram 1, coat pieces

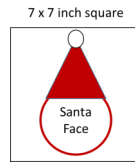

**Step 3:** Make a quilt sandwich using the completed coat, the backing fabric and batting. Quilt as desired. We quilted horizontal rows on the belt and a diagonal pattern on the Buffalo plaid.

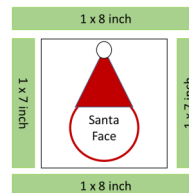
**Step 4:** Make a hanging sleeve and attach to the top of the 25 x 7.75 section of Santa's coat.

**Step 5:** Make the belt buckle.

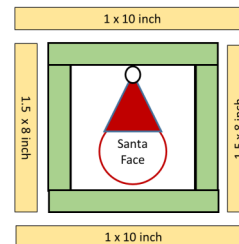
Cut Santa's face to measure 7 x 7 inches square



Attach the 1.5"x 7" green strips to left and right side of Santa Face and attach the 1.5"x 8" green strips to the top and bottom of the Santa Face



Attach the 1.5"x 8" gold strips to the left and right side of the Santa Face and attach the 1.5"x 10" gold strips to the top and bottom of the Santa Face

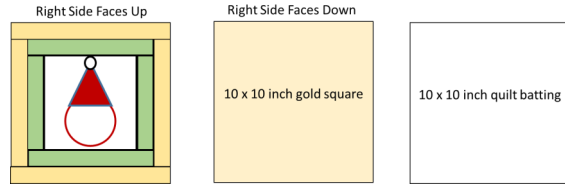




## Step 6: Make the belt buckle sandwich

Place Santa face right side up on work surface on top of Santa face, place 10" x 10" gold square right side down.

Place 10x10 inch batting square on top of the backing fabric.



Using 1/4" seam, sew around the outside of the belt buckle, leaving a 4" opening on one side (Diagram 5).

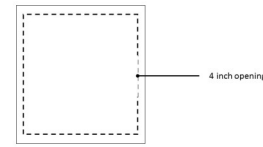

Trim the corners of the belt buckle (Diagram 6)

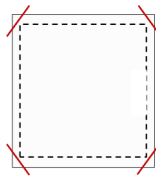

Turn the belt buckle right side out. Use a wooden dowel to ensure that the corner are flat. Close the 4" opening with hand stitching.

Quilt the belt buckle, as desired, by machine or by hand.

## Step 7: Attach two fur strips to Santa's Coat

Pin the 3.25 x 17 inch and the 3.25 x 5 inch fur strips to the quilted coat as detailed in Diagram 7.

Before sewing the fur to the coat, check to make sure the belt buckle will cover the raw edges of the fur as detailed in Diagram 7. DO NOT attach the buckle just yet!

Remove the buckle and sew the fur to the coat using a small zig zag stitch.

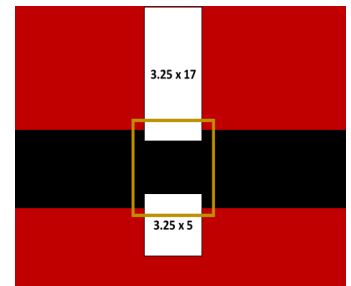

## Step 8: Attach the belt buckle to Santa's Coat

Once the fur has been attached to the coat, place the belt buckle over the raw edges of the fur.

BASTE the buckle to the belt, making sure the raw edges of the fur are covered by the buckle.

Stitch in the ditch around the left and right sides of the green border to attach the buckle as detailed in Diagram 8.

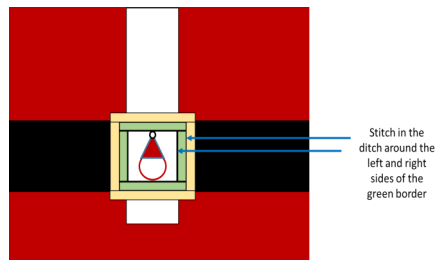

## Step 9: Attach the bottom fur strip

With the back side of Santa's Coat facing up, pin the 3.25 x 17" fur strip to the bottom of the coat, with the FUR SIDE FACING DOWN (or the wrong side of the fur strip facing up).

Attach the fur using a 1/4 inch seam (Diagram 9)

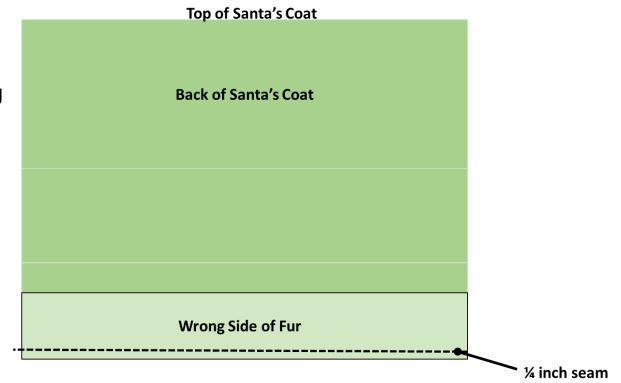

Turn Santa's coat right side up. Flip the fur trim to bring it to the front of Santa's Coat and pin in place, making sure to cover the raw edge of the bottom of the 3.25 x 5 inch fur strip. The fuzzy/furry side of the fur should be facing up on the front of the coat.

Attach the fur using a small zig zag stitch (Diagram 10).

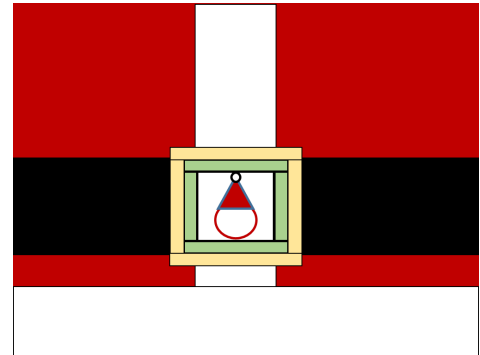


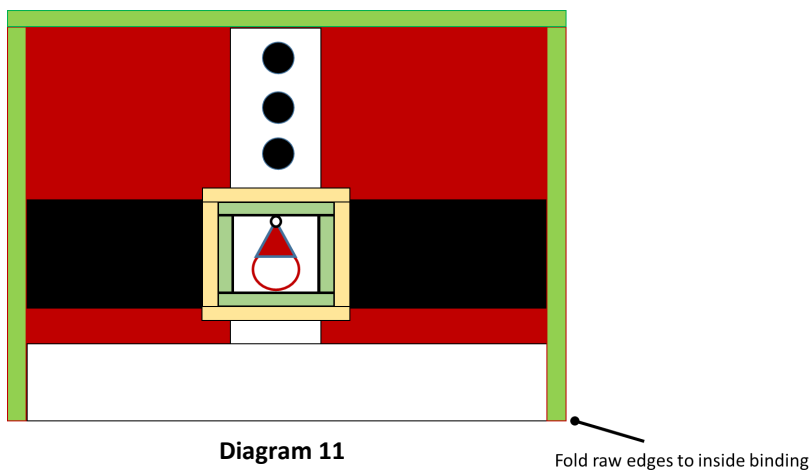

## Step 10: Attach the binding

Piece together the binding strips and with right sides together, press the strips.

For the purposes of this pattern, the binding strips are green. Fold the raw edge of one side of the binding strip to the inside. Attach the binding strip to the quilt. When you reach the opposite side, and you have about ten inches of binding not sewn down, cut the binding, leaving approximately 1 inch of extra binding fabric. (Diagram 11)

Fold the raw edge of this extra binding fabric to the inside of the binding strip, making sure the binding strip is even with the bottom of Santa's Coat. Finish sewing down the binding.



## Step 11: Attach the Buttons to Santa's Coat

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
