Finished Size: 6 inches wide x 4 inches tall



Gray Barn Design Notes

- * All seams are 1/4 inch , unless otherwise noted in instructions
- * Press seams as indicated
- * Sew seams with right sides together

Quilting Math

1/4 inch = .25 inch

1/2 inch = .5 inch

3/4 inch = .75 inch

" is the symbol for inch

From white/cream scraps, cut:

- (3) 1.25"x 7" strips
- (2) 1" x 7" strips
- (2) 1.25" x 8" strips
- (1) 1 x 8" strip
- (2) circles for eyes

From black scraps, cut:

- (1) 1.25" x 7" strip
- (2) circles for eyes

From black print, cut:

(2) 2.25" x 14" strips for binding

From purple scrap, cut:

(1) 5" x 7" rectangle for backing

From batting scrap, cut:

(1) 5" x 7" rectangle

Other supplies: Fabric glue



Mummy Face

1. Referring to Diagram 1 below, lay out the 1.25" x 7" strips and the 1" x 7" strips and sew the strips together. Press seams open. This unit should now measure 4" tall x 7" wide.

- 2. Make a quilt sandwich by placing the 5" x 7" backing fabric on your work surface with the **wrong** side up. Place the 5" x 7" batting rectangle on top of the wrong side of the backing fabric. Finally, place the unit created in Diagram 1 right side up on the batting rectangle.
- 3. Referring to Diagram 2, use a zig zag stitch to sew a 1.25" x 8" strip diagonally to the quilt sandwich created in Step 2. The edges won't be even but don't worry about this, you will be cutting them off in Step 6.







Mummy Face

4. Referring to Diagram 3, place another 1.25" x 8" strip on the diagonal, making sure to create an angle over the edge of the black strip. Use a zig zag stitch to attach this strip to the quilt sandwich. The edges won't be even but don't worry about this, you will be cutting them off in Step 6.



5. Referring to Diagram 4, place the 1" x 8" strip on the diagonal and use a zig zag stitch to attach this strip to the quilt sandwich. The edges won't be even but don't worry about this, you will be cutting them off soon!


The zig zag stitch serves as the quilting for this pattern...no free motion quilting required!



Mummy Face

6. Referring to Diagram 5, trim the left and the right side of the Mummy face so it measures 6 inches wide.

Trim the bottom of the Mummy face so it measures 4 inches tall and random fabric angles have been cut off. The Mummy Face should now measure 4 inches tall and 6 inches wide.



7. Make the Mummy eyes by using the patterns below. Adjust the circle sizes as needed to fit the Mummy Face. Attach the eyes with fabric glue.



- 8. Sew the 2.25" binding strips together and attach to the Mummy Face using your favorite binding method.
- 9. Sit down for a nice cup of Halloween brew with your new mug rug!
